Stones and Cones

A three-in-a-row game in the woods



Age: 5+

Time: 1 minute

Young children can learn and play this two-player game.

Here's How:

- **1. Follow the trail into the Children's Discovery Forest**. In the center of the forest, you will see a clearing with logs sitting up, some of them with 9-square grids on top.
- **2.** One player gathers a handful of cones from the ground, and the other gathers a handful of stones.
- 3. The player with the cones places one cone in one of the 9 squares.
- **4.** Then the player with the stones **places one stone in one of the remaining 8 squares**.
- **5.** Play continues to alternate between players until all squares are filled with cones or stones.
- 6. The way to win is to get 3 cones or 3 stones in a horizontal row, vertical column, or diagonal.
 - > The photo shows three cones in a diagonal, so the cones win.
- 7. If no one gets three cones or stones in a row, column, or diagonal, that means both players were playing very carefully and no one wins.
- 8. When you play again, the player with stones begins.

The Back Story:

Playing stones and cones enhances manual dexterity and strategy skills, and teaches patience, turn-taking, and good sportsmanship.
